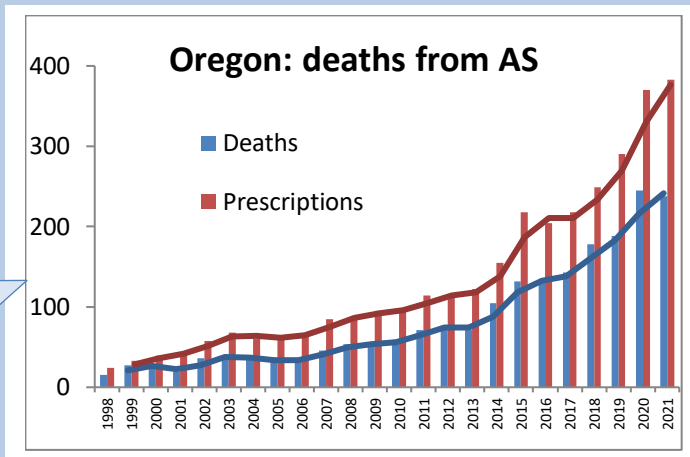


The reality of assisted dying in Oregon (updated to 2021)¹



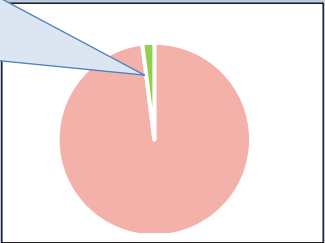
Assisted deaths have more than quadrupled in the last 10 years¹



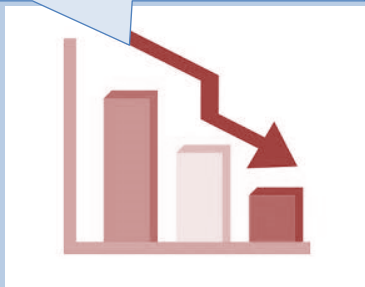
In 2021, 54% felt being a burden was a reason for requesting an assisted death (double % of 10yrs ago)¹



Less than 2% of Oregon doctors prescribe (one wrote 47 prescriptions).
Not known if 106 deaths were because of previous prescription



The US is 43rd in end-of-life care rankings (↓34 places since 2015)^{2,3}



Complications occurred in nearly 1 in 10 (9.3%).¹

Drug cocktails of 4-5 drugs used. On their 4th mixture in 7yrs which have caused prolonged deaths¹



Only 13% of assisted deaths had seen a specialist palliative care team⁴



NO ENTRY
in 2012, 66% of hospices did not allow staff to take part in assisted deaths⁵



Much official information is missing such as 68% of data on complications¹
Source material is destroyed 1yr after death⁶

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
