



### **Definitions**

Assisted suicide is the act of deliberately assisting another person to kill themselves<sup>1</sup>

*Euthanasia* is the act of deliberately ending injecting lethal drugs to end a person's life



# **Eligibility criteria**

4.4% of the world's population

## Large variations between jurisdictions

- all legislations have widened their criteria beyond a terminal diagnosis eg. Oregon, Canada, Belgium, Netherlands
- wider criteria exist in some (mental illness, children)
  eg. Netherlands, Belgium
- several plan to expand their criteria further, eg Canada



# **Decision-making and monitoring**

- No jurisdictions use legal courts to decide on eligibility
  - All use one or two doctors
- All jurisdictions monitor after the death
  - None check decisions before the death
- Data collected is sketchy and variable
